Student Behaviour and Academic Contract Ottawa-Montréal-Québec Trip 2023

In order to ensure a successful trip, it is important to outline rules and expectations for students to follow. They need to demonstrate commitment to their schooling and to the Branton community as a whole before, during, and after the trip.

This experience will provide students with a better knowledge, understanding, and acceptance of different cultures and people around the world. It is expected that each student follows and respects the rules of each of their classrooms, meet expectations of their teachers, and strive to achieve their personal best academically and socially.

The behaviour of each student will not only affect them but will also extend to their teacher supervisors, parents, hosts, as well as Branton school relationship with our service provider. The consequences of student behaviour will not be restricted to each individual alone. Each student's personal conduct is based on respect for themselves as an individual, as well as the group as a whole. Students will be expected to be on their best behaviour while at school, so it is imperative that they show they are capable of such behaviour in class. Specific trip expectations will be laid out in a few weeks.

In order to ensure that students are showing commitment to their own personal growth as well as the trip as a whole, at the end of every month they will have each of their core teachers sign the contract included with this paper. The contract will be based on the following expectations:

Behaviour

Students are expected to be positive citizens, in school and online. They are to promote good classroom habits and adhere to the expectations of their classroom teachers.

Academic

Students are expected to put forth their best effort in class. They need to be responsible for productive work habits and open communication with their teachers. Students need to make sure they are handing in their assigned work on time and to the best of their ability. Students will be missing *five* school days and therefore need to demonstrate that they are responsible enough to catch up on the work that will be missed.

Speaking French in Class

The purpose of this trip is to promote French language and culture. It is an expectation that students show their interest for this trip by using their French language skills in class. It is expected that students speak to their teachers and classmates in French at all times.

If there is concern from one of their core teachers, a meeting with the student, parents, and teachers will be required to assess if the student continues to be a proper fit for the trip. If issues persist, the school reserves the right to review and potentially remove the student from attending the trip.

Students are expected to regularly attend school.
